Alternative, Augmentative Communication: Using switch at Wairoa School.

We have purchased many switches which are being used by all classes to enhance student engagement. You would be surprised at how they creatively, and effectively they have been used across the school. Here is just one example: -



The students within the Primary 5 classroom have thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to have additional switches brought into their classroom to support their engagement and comprehension in learning. This past week the students used the switches to answer who questions related to their English text the 3 little pigs. Within their maths unit of work lesson on time the switches were used as a resource to support their understanding of what day of the week specific school-based activities occur. In our maths

foundation lessons on number the students were shown number cards 1-5 out of order. They were asked to when shown the number card to then touch the correct numerical dice faced switch that paired with that number card.

Attendance – Everyday matters

We want students to attend school every day when they are well enough to do so. Please send a note indicating the reason they have been away from school in their diary and / or inform the school office via email or phone call.

If your child is absent from school, please advise the office via email or phone call. All student absences are required to be explained.



Health and Wellbeing

Student Arrivals and Departures

I would like to remind all parents/carers of the following: School commences every day at 8.55 am and the expectation is that each student arrives between 8.55 – 9.15am so that they can participate in morning routines which include fitness and personal care.

Late arrivals to school are disruptive to your child's learning and that of the other students.

Variation to approved assisted school travel

Any variation to approved travel arrangements requires a form to be completed. This includes a change of residential address or drop off and pick up addresses. This approval must be submitted *10 working days* prior to the required variation.

School Uniform

We ask that all students wear the school uniform each day. Wearing the school uniform is an excellent reminder to students that the day is a school day.

It is important as community access programs are commencing that students wear the uniform in school and within the community-based programs.

Please ensure that **all items are labelled** so valuable time is not spent searching for unlabelled lost items. Please remember to do this for all uniforms items.

The summer uniform includes:

- Navy blue shorts
- Pale blue polo shirt
- Black shoes or appropriate sports shoes

As we move into cooler months our winter uniform includes:

- Navy blue track pants
- Pale blue polo shirt long sleeved
- Navy blue fleecy jumper
- Black shoes or appropriate sports shoes
